## **WHAT'S MISSING**

The National Housing Strategy and BC's Gender-Based Violence Action Plan both recognize the right to housing, but lack concrete tools to make it real for survivors

**Operating funding, staff resources, and tenancy supports are missing**

**Programs remain siloed: leaving survivors to navigate complex systems alone**

**Data on GBV housing needs remains incomplete or outdated**

## **MOVE FROM STRATEGY TO IMPLEMENTATION**

1. Dedicated GBV housing operating funds
2. Stable rent supplements for survivors
3. Transparent accountability framework

## **WHAT THIS MEANS**

Local providers report turning away survivors due to lack of funding, not lack of commitment



The lack of coordination and accountability across ministries and governments leaves survivors unsupported



Without reliable operating funds and intersectional data, service providers cannot plan long-term or respond flexibly to local needs
